



MAINTENANCE GUIDE GLUE-DOWN LUXURY VINYL FLOORING

1. IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE INSTALLATION

NOTE: Just note that if your floor is glued down to the subfloor, you have to take into account the drying time of your glue. Please use only premium vinyl adhesives and follow the manufacturer's instructions carefully.

- Remove all loose debris from the floor with a vacuum cleaner or a soft broom first, and then with a damp micro-fibre mop.
- Use just water until your water is clear and no dirt is left on the floor.
- Glue, plaster and paint residues should be removed as soon as possible with a cloth. (Note: No thinners, turpentine or solvents to be used).
- Most residues can be removed with water and an appropriate vinyl flooring cleaning product.

2. DAILY CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- As particles of dirt and grit left behind can damage the surface of the floor, clean your floor regularly.
- Start by removing all dirt and dust with a soft broom or a vacuum cleaner. Do not use the beater bar on your vacuum.
- Then, clean with water and a neutral detergent such as Industroclean Proclean.
- Do not use aggressive cleaning products, soap, abrasive cleaners or cleaning products that contain wax or oil.
- We recommend using a well-rung damp mop or a cloth.
- Remove stains as soon as possible. Worn-in stains are difficult to remove.
- After washing allow your floor the time to dry.

3. MAINTENANCE PRODUCTS

We recommend using only premium maintenance products. List of Industroclean products here.**PROTECTING**

- Microfibre Mopping System and Industroclean Proclean for mopping
- For larger areas and for stubborn marks, a single disk machine and 3M Red Pad with Proclean can be used





- Avoid bringing dirt, sand, grit and substances, such as oil or asphalt indoors by placing non-rubber backed carpets and doormats at all entrances.
- Do not use rubber-backed mats as long-lasting contact with the rubber can cause permanent stains.
- Do not allow cigarettes, matches or other very hot items to get in contact with the floor as this may cause permanent damage.
- Do not drag or slide heavy objects across the floor.
- When moving appliances or heavy furniture it is always wise to lay a plywood panel, or similar, on your floor and "walk" the item across it. This protects your floor from scuffing, gouging and tears.
- Apply appropriate protection to the legs of the furniture. Do not use coloured floor protectors.
- Apply freely rotating, non-rubber wheels to chairs with castors and/or use protective matting.
- Please bear in mind that pets with sharp nails can leave deep scratches on the floor.
